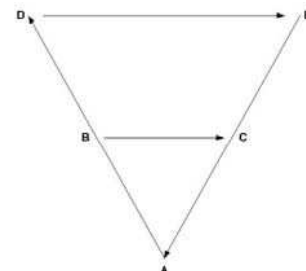

IN-HAND TRIANGLE PROCEDURE

In-hand classes 1 – 25 will perform individually on the triangle measuring approximately 30 meters on each side, and 15 meters from B-C, or sized, if judge specifies, as described in USEF DR209. When called by the Ringmaster, follow the procedure as diagramed:



- Stand horse at A for conformation judging
- Walk small triangle: A - B - C - A
- Trot large triangle A - D - E - A
- Leave judging area promptly unless requested otherwise by judges.

GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS**1. LEVELS**

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Sport horse Classes will be held in sequence in indoor arena. Warm-up will be in nearby fenced bluestone arena. Classes 1-19 will not be combined. Saturday & Sunday's

Dressage classes will be outdoors. Management reserves right to combine, divide, or cancel any class, except as limited by this Prize List. There will be a lunch break and separate breaks as judge requires.

2. DATES USED IN PRIZE LIST

Opening Date: Wednesday July 1, 2010

Closing Date: Saturday July 31, 2010

3. AWARDS

6 ribbons will be presented in each class except in championship classes. Special champion and reserve ribbons, trophies, or sashes will be awarded to championship classes. Each horse that qualifies here for the Great American Insurance Group / USDF Breeders' Championships at NEDA Fall Festival in September will receive special ribbon from USDF. Grand Championship will receive facility sponsored plate.

3.1 NEW ENGLAND BREED SHOW SERIES SWEEPSTAKES & \$2100 NEDA FALL SHOW PURSE

Entry into the Sweepstake is \$50/horse per qualifying Breed Show. The top score from the primary in hand age group USDF class for the horse (foal, yearlings, 2 year old, 3 year old, mares, stallions) only will count towards the award. Only 1 score per show per horse qualifies. The top 6 scoring horses of the qualifying show will get the Sweepstakes cash award. Minimum award for 1st place \$50-100 depending upon entries and class sponsors. Entries have to be in by the shows closing date. No exceptions. Awards are based on entries at the closing and can not be changed. If there is less than 6 entries, only the number of entries will be awarded.

Each horse that enters and competes at a sweepstakes at a qualifying New England Breed show automatically qualifies for the NEDA Fall Breed Show Sweepstakes for free. No Sweepstakes fee is charged at the NEDA Fall Show, but the class entry fee is still required. The qualifying horse must enter and compete in the NEDA Fall Breed Show primary age group class (foal, yearling, 2 year old, 3 year old, mares, stallions) to receive the Sweepstakes prize for that show. NEDA will provide a cash award to the top 6 "colts" and top 6 "fillies" at the NEDA Fall Show. 1st place \$300, 2nd \$250, 3rd \$200, 4th \$150, 5th, \$100, 6th \$50.

4. ENTRIES

Separate entries are required for each show. An Entry is a Rider / Handler and Horse combination. Each Entry requires a separate Entry Form. A separate Bridle Number is issued to each Entry. If a Rider in an under saddle class is different than the Handler in in-hand class(es) a separate entry form must be sent for each; a separate competitor number will be issued for each combination.

4.1 ENTRY FEES

Do not enter and no charge for Championship classes: 3, 6, 7, 12, 17, 18, and 19. All other class fees are listed next to the class number and description.

5.0 ENTRY FORMS

5.1 Entry Forms: Remittance

Remit Entries via mail to Show Secretary **ONLY** – Show Manager cannot process your entry. Complete USDF / USEF documentation and payment of any fees due for each Rider / Handler, Owner, Trainer, and Coach (if applicable) must accompany Entry. See Table just above for details. Send FedEx (or any other express mail) using no signature option. Rider and Owner contact information must be complete; be sure to include an email address for Show Secretary to contact both Rider / Handler and Owner.

5.2 Entry Forms: Coggins

Every horse (except foals under 6 months) must supply non-returnable copy of Negative coggins that has been done within one year of show date. No exceptions. It is recommended that you have your horses up-to-date on all vaccinations.

5.3 Entry Forms: Signature Requirements

Every Entry Form must contain signature of: (1) Rider Handler, or parent / guardian / trainer if under 18 on previous December 1; (2) Trainer; (3) Owner, and (4) Coach (if acting as Coach at the competition). The word "same" will be rejected. Trainer must be on grounds during competition and sign Entry Form. Copied / faxed signatures are acceptable.

5.4 Entry Forms: Incomplete or Late Entries

No refunds for competitor entry errors. Show Secretary reserves the right to delay processing of any incomplete Entry Form(s) until all required information (including required breed registration documentation), signatures and payment are complete. Incomplete Entry Forms may thereby lose priority for "first come, first serve" processing mentioned in this prize list; they may fall onto Wait List; they may be required to pay late fees (per the above table) at the point Entry Form is complete; they may lose priority for stabling. "First come / first serve" policies may be applied depending on point at which Entry Form is complete, not point at which Entry Form is received by Show Secretary. An entry is considered "post entry" at midnight Saturday July 25, 2009 and will incur a \$100 fee after that time to enter the show.

5.5 Entry Forms: Non-Compete Horses / Non-Compete Broodmares

All non-competing horses on grounds must complete an Entry Form and pay Office Fee, and fees for any stabling desired. Exception is for broodmares with accompanying foal only. They do not pay Drug or membership fees. Horse will be assigned a Bridle Number which must be worn at all times when out of stall or off the trailer.

5.6 Entry Forms: Payment

Entry form will not be processed without full payment. We are accepting credit cards (MC/VISA) provided a detailed summary of fees is included. Make checks out to Maplewood Warmbloods; checks (including those on Wait List) will be deposited upon receipt. No-number deposits; any included will not be refunded. Competitor is responsible for non-negotiable check fees of \$40.

5.7 Entry Forms: Postmark Date

All Entries will be assigned a Postmark Date by which they will be processed in all "first come / first serve" processing outlined in this Prize List. This date shall be date mailed if by US mail or any form of express mail. Show Secretary shall penalize Entry Forms with Postmark Date prior to Opening Date. Show Secretary may adjust Postmark Date to that date upon which an incomplete Entry Form becomes complete.

6.0 ACCEPTANCE POLICIES

6.1 Acceptance: Entries

Send all entries on or after Opening Date only. Avoid additional fees by being timely, correct, and organized.

6.2 Acceptance: Class Limits

Show will be scheduled and assigned specific performance times. Show Secretary will accept rides and fill show and stabling on a first come basis depending on Postmark Date. A Wait List will be created, if the show overfills, on first come basis depending on Postmark Date. Before and on Closing Date, competitors may scratch classes / stabling with full refund of class entry fees and stabling fees provided Secretary has been notified by Written Notification. Upon receipt of Entry, Office Fee is non-refundable, before and after Closing Date. See Competitor Communications.

6.3 Acceptance: Assignment of Bridle Numbers

A Bridle Number belongs to the Rider / Handler and Horse combination. If a horse is handled by one person and ridden under saddle by another, two entry forms must be remitted and two Bridle Numbers will be assigned, one for each combination. Each combination will keep the same Bridle Number throughout the Event and it must worn, from the time of arrival until the end of the Event, by the horse, competitor or handler at all times, when the horse is being handled, exercised or shown on the grounds so that it may be identified by the stewards.

7.0 COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS

7.1 Communications: Website

The Maplewood Warmbloods website (www.maplewoodwarmbloods.com) will be used to keep show competitors informed by posting show as it is filling and after scheduling when times are set. Check under the "news" page.

7.2 Communications: Entry Confirmation

Entries confirmations will not be mailed. Instead, Show Secretary shall post details of each class, as show fills, on the Maplewood website. She will also maintain as much communication with competitors as possible using email. Be sure to include email address on each Entry Form. Check all information carefully and notify Entry Secretary immediately of errors. No guarantee of show reporting corrections and additional information given after Closing Date.

7.3 Communications: Written Notification

Written Notification consists of: (1) notification to Show Secretary (preferred) or Show Manager by email or fax and (2) reply by email or fax from Show Secretary or Show Manager. No changes or refunds will be processed without both (1) and (2) above. Keep your paperwork. To be safe send all written communications to both Show Secretary and Show Manager.

7.4 Communications: Times / Stabling Assignments

After Closing Date performance times will be scheduled for both Dressage Show and Breed Show and stalls will be assigned. Times (tentative) will be posted on the Maplewood Warmbloods' website approximately one day after Closing Date. No times will be mailed. Final times will be posted at Headquarters during show. Check them! Do not assume website or program times. Competitors will be notified by email or telephone, as much as possible, of any changes.

7.5 Communications: Scores

Scores will stand as posted unless challenged during show.

7.6 Distribution of Awards at Show

With the exception of ribbons distributed at Awards Ceremonies, all Awards will be distributed from the main office to the person who says he/she is representing the competitor. This person will be given all prizes and will be asked to sign for them. This person accepts responsibility for further distribution of ribbons & prizes and any other awards.

7.7 Communications: Post Show Mailing of Tests / Awards

Class tests and awards not picked up during the show will not be mailed to competitor. Competitor forfeits awards not picked up. If you are not available, have a friend pick them up.

8.0 CHANGES / REFUNDS

8.1 Changes / Refunds: Changes, Scratches, Adds After Closing Date and at Show

Every Time Slot consists of a (1) Time; (2) Bridle Number; (3) Horse; and (4) Rider/Handler. Any change requires extensive computer adjustment and reissuing of reports. Therefore, after Closing Date changes may be only done by:

(1) scratching the Time Slot, no refund; and

(2) filling an available Time Slot by paying the full entry fee for the class; in the case of substitution of Horse and / or Rider in the same Time Slot the full entry fee must be (re) paid because a new Bridle Number must be entered into the class and test sheets updated

Scratches may be only done by:

(1) Forfeiting the Time Slot, no refund.

(2) Adds may be only done by: Filling an available Time Slot or placement on Wait List, in either case by paying full entry fee. In addition, any Change or Add that requires issuance of new Bridle Number (and therefore new Entry Form into the computer system) will be charged post entry fee of \$30 (on or before Close Date) or \$100 (after close Date and at show).

The only exception is a change of person listed as Rider to another Handler for an in-hand class. In this case a Handler can sign an Entry Form and handle the horse without penalty provided no other changes are made to the

Time Slot. Any other changes incur penalties above. The above policies to maintain the Order of Go as printed in the program will be maintained barring unexpected events, which force other actions.

8.2 Changes / Refunds: Refund Policies Any refund monies will be issued after show and mailed to that person listed as Owner on Entry. Full refunds, except for Office Fee & stabling scratch fee, through Closing Date only with Written Notification (email, fax, US mail) to Show Secretary (with preferably copy to Show Manager) and with written receipt from Secretary. Other than stabling refunds (see below), there will be no refunds after Closing Date. No refunds for: number deposits; Affidavit fees; Breed/Discipline fees. No refunds for expulsion from show; elimination from class(es). No refunds for competitor error(s). No refunds for cancellation of Event, portion(s) of Event and / or class(es) for any reason including (but not exclusively) situations resulting from: grounds (or portion of grounds) unavailable / unusable to Maplewood Warmbloods show management for any reason; inclement weather; Acts of God; local / national emergency, act(s) of terrorism.

9.0 STABLING

9.1 Stabling: Stalls A limited number of permanent 12 x 12 stalls with doors available for \$150. First come first serve.

Remaining competitors will be in temporary 10x10 stabling with doors. No cleaning deposit required. Tack stalls available upon request for \$150. Stalls will be stripped before competitor arrives. Breed show competitors arriving Thur and vacating by 4pm Friday will only be charged \$100. Beyond 4pm (time will be adjusted per breed show times) will be charged full price. Competitor does not have to strip stall upon departure. The farm will open to competitors on Thursday, August 5, 2009 after 2:00 PM. Horses must vacate the facility by 9:00 PM on Sunday. Make arrangements with farm management if you need to be outside these hours. **YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DAMAGE YOU OR YOUR HORSE CAUSES TO THE FACILITY.**

9.2 Stabling: Assignments Stalls belong to the Horse in the Entry Form with which payment is received and will be assigned accordingly. All stalls will be assigned by show management. Tack stall request may only accompany Horse Stall request, on the same Entry; ie no Tack Stall requests without Horse Stall on the same Entry. No substitution of horses, changing of these stall assignments or occupancy of any other stall without permission from Show Management. Please fill out your stall cards entirely so that night security can fully do their jobs.

9.3 Stabling Rules: Barn opens after 3:00 PM on Friday until 10:00 PM; 6:00 AM on Saturday until 9:00 PM. No exceptions, our competitors need to rest. Power (110V only) is available. All electrical cords must be 12 gauge, 3-wire negative ground with connections conforming to state and county codes. No cords to be run across driveways or walkways or where horses & people will be walking. No Class I Flammable Liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside any buildings or tents neither on the grounds, nor anywhere (inside or outside buildings) in the stabling areas. No gas, electric or propane heaters, tanks or hot plates (inside or outside buildings) are allowed in the stabling areas. Sharps boxes will be located in stabling area per USEF requirements.

Night watch will be provided 6:00 PM until 6:00 AM at show expense.

9.6 Stabling: Acceptance Policies

Horse and tack stalls will be filled on first come basis, depending on Postmark Date.
